This was precisely my experience when exiting Sky Harbor Airport, the discomfort of which I quickly forgot: for I was greeted by a group of new, friendly SAI faces as I boarded the shuttle to the 49th National Convention.

I didn't believe it at the time, but you do grow accustomed to the weather - especially when roaming the convention center, grinning at fellow sisters (who you'd never met before) and squealing as you run to those you haven't seen in eons. When I think back on those five days, it seems impossible all that we fit into that time: daily general sessions; sisterhood-wide rituals; multiple concerts and meals together; and, naturally, shopping for any SAI gear you can imagine at Phlea Phlam.

Making Macarons!

Ingredients for macarons:

- -1 cup of almond flour
- -2 cups of powdered
- -3 egg whites at room temperature
- -1/4 tsp cream of tartar
- -1/4 cup granulated sugar
- -1 tsp vanilla extract
- -Pinch of salt
- -Red gel food coloring (not liquid must be gel!)

Ingredients for filling

- -1 stick of unsalted butter softened
- -1 1/2 cups of powdered sugar
- -2 tbsp heavy cream or whole milk
- -1/2 tsp vanilla extract
- -Preserves, jam or jelly of choice (I used cherry preserves)

To make the macarons:

- 1) Preheat an oven to 275 degrees
- 2) Sift powdered sugar and almond flour together.
- 3) Beat egg whites, cream of tartar and salt on high until foamy. Slowly add the granulated sugar and continue mixing until soft peaks form.
- 4) Add vanilla and gel food coloring.
- 5) Continuing mixing until stiff peaks
- 6) Pour the almond mixture over the egg whites slowly and fold together. When the batter reaches ribbon stage, it is ready.
- 7) Prepare pans with parchment paper.
 Using a decorating bag and tip, pipe
 1 inch circles of batter spaced at least
 1 inch apart.
- 8) Bang pans on the counter a few times and let sit for 30 minutes to form a skin.
- 9) Bake for 18-20 minutes.

Prepare buttercream:

- 1) While the macarons are cooling, beat the butter on medium until smooth.
- 2) Add the powdered sugar and mix for 1-2 minutes.
- 3) Add the heavy cream or milk and vanilla. Add more if needed until you achieve the desired consistency.

Assembly:

- 1) Once the macarons are completely cool, pipe a ring of buttercream leaving a space in the middle for the preserves.
- 2) Fill a plastic bag with preserves, cut of the tip and pipe into the center of the macaron.
- 3) Pipe a small bit of buttercream of the preserves and sandwich macaron with another cookie.
